STRATTON — The Stratton School Garden Committee had its annual seed planting day April 28 as part of a school-wide Healthy Nutrition Initiative. The HNI has helped students learn about the many aspects of growing a successful garden from seed and the importance of a healthy diet.

For the past four years, there has been a steady fundraising effort to purchase a Grow Dome that will facilitate a 10-month growing season. The produce will then supplement the school's breakfast and lunch programs.
