Dear Parents/Guardians,

The Department of Education has mandated schools to provide a model policy that addresses child sexual abuse prevention. This is multi-faceted, in that there is mandatory training for all staff members, curriculum programming for Pre-K- 5th grade students and mandated reporting procedures when there is a suspicion of child sexual abuse.

Stratton School has partnered with SAPARS, Safe Voices and Franklin County Children's Task Force in providing evidence-based curricula on a yearly basis since 2016. The curriculum that is used is from the Healthy Relationship Project. Pre-K through 2nd graders receive the <u>Care for Kids</u> curriculum, 3rd-6th grade students receive the <u>We Care</u> curriculum. <u>SAFE-T</u> curriculum is presented to 7-8th graders. While the policy does not mandate the school to provide education to 6-8th grade students, we feel that the continuity is extremely important. These agencies are welcome in our schools to present this education on a yearly basis, typically with a 6 lesson unit. These programs align with the Maine Learning Results Health Education Standards. I am happy to report that this year lessons will be provided in person by Stephanie Harmon and Paula Murray from SAPARS. Grades 6-8 will begin lessons the week of 12/5/22 and lessons for elementary classes will begin after the new year.
