Dear Parents/Guardians,

The Department of Education has mandated schools to provide a model policy that addresses child sexual abuse prevention. This is multi-faceted, in that there is mandatory training for all staff members, curriculum programming for Pre-K-5th grade students and mandated reporting procedures when there is a suspicion of child sexual abuse.

Stratton School has partnered with Sexual Assault Prevention and Response Services (SAPARS) in providing The Healthy Relationship Project curriculum since 2016 for all of our students which meets the state mandate. Next week Stephanie Harmon and Paula Murray from SAPARS will begin working with Pre-K though Grade 2 on the <u>Care For Kids program</u>. The lessons will center around asking for help, feelings, bodies, babies and asking permission. Each unit teaches and reinforces simple and age-appropriate messages through circles time, books, and crafts. The activities are designed to compliment the fact that children of this age group learn naturally through play. Information is presented in a matter of fact way using anatomically correct language.
