1. EEI Proposal Update – Barry presented to the board EEI's Project Scope Options on the Solar and heating project. (Information attached). He noted that we had posted an Ad in the Daily Bulldog that we are currently looking for an energy company to help with our energy needs at the school at present and in the future. The Ad will run through March 15, 2024. EEI is the only company that has responded with interest at present. There was discussion with the board on the options. 

## Notes

Through a tax exempt lease purchase EEI guarantees the yearly savings and performance of the design.

The first payment is not due until 1 YEAR after the contract (at construction completion), so there is an option of utilizing existing budget funds in the amout of the rebate, to buy down the project cost, which would reduce the financing amount and then at replensih that money when the rebate is recieved.

In these estimate analysis, I used the rebate to make the first year payment. If that approach was taken, then your first payment from within the budget would not be until your 2 payument (3 years from the date of the contract)
